Dear Parents/Carers,

I am pleased to enclose your child's Autumn Interim Report.

Interim reports are a snapshot of how your child is approaching their learning and the progress they are making. Their purpose is to help school and home work together to support pupils' learning, identifying any concerns promptly. Parents will receive another interim report in March and a more detailed, personalised Main Report in July.

Key points about your child's progress report:

Learning Profiles and Targets

This report gives an indication of a pupil's attitude to their school life in the form of an 'Attitude to Learning Profile' for each subject. This is a description of how your child's attitude and behaviour affect their learning. We have also included a summary of their behaviour points. Many pupils have collected a number of positive points for good attitude and behaviour. If your child has negative behaviour points, these are a reflection of lessons where your child has fallen below expected standards and so received 1 or 0 points.

In order to help you understand what your child needs to do next in each subject area, staff have indicated (where applicable) a target. Please see the key on the report which will help you identify the target relevant to your child at this early stage of the year. For some subjects, there may not be a specific target yet as it is too early in the year for an accurate assessment to be made. However, later reports will give a clearer indication as staff get to know your child.

Projected Attainment

The projected attainment is a prediction of what a pupil will achieve compared to national expectation, based on their current attainment and if they maintain their current effort.

We assess using the developing, meeting and exceeding system which was introduced to you at the New Parents' Evening in September, where 'meeting' is in line with National expectation.

Foundation Subjects

In the foundation subjects (not English or Maths) where pupils are only taught once a week, it is too early in the year for an accurate assessment to be made. It is likely that the projections for these subjects will be blank. Again, later reports will report pupils' progress in these subjects.

Parents' Consultation Evenings:

As always, if you have any concerns, there will be an opportunity to make a 5 minute appointment with your child's subject teacher to discuss this report on the Parents' Consultation Evening for Year 5 and 7 parents only on **Wednesday 5th December 4.00 – 6.30pm** in the School Hall (Y6 and 8 parents' evenings will be held in January after their reports are published).

Booking Appointments
